


The Co-Parent Hub is a free website to help you while you make your child arrangements ... and beyond.

Here is what separated parents have told us about how the Co-Parent Hub helped them. Everyone we asked who tried it has said they would recommend it to a friend.

This is what you get

- When you create your account, you will be able to use all of these options from a source you can trust:
- Start a **Parenting Plan** with your ex-partner. Co-Parent Hub is a neutral space where you can interact with each other to agree things. This leads to better co-operation and better outcomes for children.
- Watch **'Getting it Right for Children'**: a set of four short scenes, which help to show the impact of conflict on children, and how best to handle different situations. The scenes also show practical ways in which you can make a difference.
- **Goal setting function**: selecting a goal on Co-Parent Hub directs you to tailored content designed to help you reach that goal. You can also write your own goals and update your progress as you go along.
- Information on a range of **dispute resolution options** which can help you.
- The **Covid-19 tab** also hosts curated content to support you during the Coronavirus lockdown.



Get started today

- To access the full website, create an account at portal.cafcass.clickrelationships.org/login/, using your email address ...
- ... then use the content that you think will help you the most.
- The site is free to use and mobile friendly ...
- ... and it is **only** for separated parents.

More information

- If you want to, you can take your completed Parenting Plan to your Mediator or Court hearing, so that the judge can see any agreements you've come to, and areas that need more thought
- If you're involved in a case with Cafcass, you can choose to share and discuss your progress with your Family Court Advisor (FCA) if you wish. No one has access to any information from your account.
- Once your case has closed, you can continue to use Co-Parent Hub and access the articles, goals and Parenting Plan that you have been working on. You may want to review your plans in future, children grow up and circumstances change.
- For the time Cafcass is involved in your case, your Family Court Adviser can help explain the website and offer any support you may need to navigate through the Co-Parent Hub, if you wish.
